

Ideas for supporting your child's learning at home:

English:

Help with English homework

Your child will receive spelling homework weekly. Please help them to look at and read the word, say the word and then cover it and try to write the word from memory. This should take 5 minutes each day and the repetition will help your child to memorise and learn the key words. They will have a spelling test on Friday. Children will also receive handwriting practice sheet. Spelling homework is to be handed in on Friday. **Please do not put this in the Maths homework folder.**

Reading with your child:

Your child will be given two books each week. Encourage your child to recognise words when reading a book. Encourage them to use a reading strategy to decode the word. We have been learning the following strategies:

- Robot the word e.g. frog f-r-o-g
- Chunk longer words into smaller words e.g. treetop tree top
- Reread the sentence from the beginning
- Think: does it look right? Does it sound right? Does it make sense?
- Picture cues


Maths:

School times and attendance

Books

Each week pupils will take home a levelled reading book and two library books. Children are required to bring their book bags to school everyday and leave in their personal tray in the classroom. Ideas on how to support your child's learning at home.

These are the topics we will be learning:

Literacy:

Fiction:

Children will be reading the story Katie in London. Katie visits several famous London landmarks in the story. They will be answering questions about the stories, role playing scenes, sequencing events and re-writing this story.

Please support your child by asking them to talk to you about the books they have read; ask them questions about what happens, talk about the characters and story line, discuss if they liked the book etc. This will help your child to understand the story.

Non-Fiction: Recount:

Children will be learning how to write a recount about our school trip to The Royal Mews at Buckingham Palace. They will be writing about the London landmarks that they saw on the school trip.

Numeracy:

Number:

The children will be learning about the place value of numbers up to 50. they will be learning to read and write numbers up to 50 in words and numerals. They will also be learning to partition numbers into tens and units, for example, $36 = 3$ tens and 6 units. They will be learning about 1 more and less with numbers up to 50.

The children are continuing to learn their number bonds to 20. Please help your child learn them.

Measurement—Length, height, weight and volume.

The children will be learning to compare the 4 measurements using comparative language, such as, taller, tallest, longer, shorter, heavier and lighter. They will be using specific equipment to measure, for example, a ruler to measure the length of objects.

Topic: London and the Queen

This half term, we will be learning all about London and the Queen. As part of our topic, we will be looking at famous London landmarks and learning how to find these landmarks on a map. We will also be learning about some history such as the Great Fire of London. We will be going on a school trip to the Royal Mews at Buckingham Palace (the horse riding stables) to learn more about the Queen and where she lives. We will be looking out for the landmarks that we have been learning about.

R.E: The children will be learning about the Easter story and the important lessons Christian people learn from this story.

PHSE: Be Safe—The children will be thinking about the making decisions how it affect themselves and those around them. They will also think about peer pressure and assertiveness. Talk to the children about making good choices and think of ways to work well with others.

Research project: Create a model of a landmark in London

Key Learning:

To develop knowledge of different landmarks in London

Success Criteria:

Choose a famous London landmark that interests you
Create a plan detailing how you will make a model of it.
Think: what collage materials will you use? What features will you include?

Create a junk model of the landmark
Write facts about the landmark

Ways to help:

- *Help your child with carrying out research online or visiting the idea store.
- * Help your child collect junk materials for their model
- *Question them about what they have read to help them understand.
- *Help them plan out their project
- *Help them manage their time. We suggest spending about 2 weeks researching, 1 week planning and 2 weeks creating their project.
