- Create a planning format to sequence notes and support the layout.
- Research different leaflet designs for inspiration.
- Create the leaflet ready to share in class.

English:

1,001 Arabian Nights

To support this term's topic 'Ancient Civilizations', we will be reading the classic text 1,001 Arabian Nights. We will be exploring the different tales and quests whilst planning and writing a contemporary quest story. We will be looking at the key features of this genre, such as the creation of a hero/heroine as a protagonist and moral symbolism. You can help at home by reading books such as 'Northern Lights' by Philip Pullman and 'The Wizard of Earthsea' by Ursula Le Guin.

Non-Fiction Comprehension

The children will be reading a range of non-fiction texts such as advertisements and letters, which they will be using to practise their comprehension skills. In

particular we will be focusing on the different layout features of texts and commenting on their purpose. You can help at home by looking at public leaflets that you can pick up in the supermarket and asking your child who the intended audience is, the purpose of the leaflet and it's effectiveness. Encourage your child to look closely at the writing and use evidence to support their opinions.

Maths:

During this half term each math group will continue to look at areas specific to them (after analysing practice papers). This will involve solving problems including decimals, multiplication, division and number facts. They will be looking at a variety of reasoning questions and arithmetic in preparation for the SATs in the next few weeks.

Topic: Ancient Civilisations

The children will be learning about the Golden era of Islamic civilisations and the many inventions created that are still in use today. In this topic, they will be researching the history of Baghdad, the epicenter of activity during the Golden age, and producing their own timelines pinpointing the key events. In addition, they will also be researching about other ancient civilisations such as, the Mayan in South America and the Benin in West Africa. As part of this unit, the children will be looking at Islamic art and their distinctive geometric patterns.

Computing:

Year 6 will have the opportunity to create an online google site. The children will plan an end of year project, to showcase all of their work. Their project will include music (garage band), prezi, pictures, voice recordings and snap shot of sketch up. It will be published and accessible via Frog - combining a range of digital resources/programs which are embedded into the site and shared with an intended audience.

RE: Is it better to express your religion in arts and architecture or in charity and generosity?

This question enables pupils to learn in depth from two different religions about why their holy buildings and works of art matter to them as expressions of devotion to God and worship, and about how they practice generosity and charity. The investigation implements the principal aim of RE, which is to engage the children through enquiry, looking at significant human questions which religion and worldviews address. This helps for them to develop the understanding and skills needed to appreciate varied responses to these questions, as well as develop responses of their own.

P.E : Volleyball

The children will practicing skills in order to play volleyball. They will be learning how to pass and receive the ball with control and accuracy as well as being able to volley the ball.

PSHE: Be Respectful

This half term the children will be looking at what makes them special and unique. They will be identifying and celebrating similarities and differences such as race, religion and gender within their class.
