Ideas on how to support your child's learning at home.

English: Discussion

This unit is based around **discussion**. The children will first be researching and note taking about Money, its origins and how it is used today. Then the children will be making notes from various texts about Brazil as they are one of the UK's trading partners. They will focus on the topic of fair trade countries in order for them to be able to write a discussion piece and prepare a debate around the issue. To help at home, get your child to research life in Brazil, especially in the developing regions. Use can also book out the follow texts from the library: **My Holiday in Brazil, Discover Brazil, Brazil—In our world**. Also you can help by practicing emotive language to use in their debates by choosing a topic of your choice to debate about with your child. E.g. Should we recycle at home? Or Should we drive to school? Encourage your child to use phrases such as In fact... One argument is that... It seems plausible... I respect your opinion, however... to help them use this type of language in their writing.

Letters

In this unit the children will read the novel 'Holes' to develop their reading strategies and comprehension skills, mainly focusing on retrieval in Part 1, before moving on to inference, deduction and authorial technique in Part 2 of the book. They will use the novel as a stimulus for letter informal and formal letter writing.

'Holes' provides many themes, such as marriage, racism and theft, which the children can explore. It also provides strong female characters, with both the warden and the outlaw being women. As an end of unit outcome the children will write a formal letter from the perspective of one the protagonist characters that explains how they were able to filter the muddy water they find in a remote location. To help your child expose them to different types of letters, formal and informal. Focus on the structure of a letter and the type of formal language that can be used.

Maths: Time

Children should be able to tell the time. They should also be able to access timetables; answering questions such as "how much later does..." or "how long does it take between".

Fractions, decimals and percentages

Children will be learning how to multiply and divide fractions. They will also solve puzzles and problems involving fractions, decimals and percentages. Please encourage your child to use the nrich website to have a go at solving some available problems online.

Topic: The children will be learning about money, its origins and evolution. In addition they will be learning about the global economy and the use of branding on various products. This will be followed by looking at one of the UK's trading partners - Brazil. Also they will be exploring issues such as fair trade and looking at the living conditions for some Brazilians who live in Favelas. In the final part of the unit, the children will be given an opportunity to become entrepreneurs and propose an idea for a stall. The winning idea will then be offered a stall to sell their product at this year's Summer Fete.

Geography - As part of their unit, the children will be researching all about Brazil. The children will have the opportunity to focus on a region in Brazil, in particular, focusing on its geographical position, size, population and climate. They will then make comparisons on between Brazil and the UK. Finally they will be looking at the products mainly imported from Brazil such as coffee, chocolate and sugar—how they are grown and harvested.

RE: What do religions say to us when life gets hard? (Continued from last half term)

In this unit pupils learn in depth from different religious and spiritual ways of life about teaching about hard times. Many of the children will have experienced grief or loss in some way. This unit allows them to talk about these ideas when emotions are less raw and how best to deal with them.

P.E: Capoeira & Athletics

The children will be taught the Brazilian marital art which combines elements of dance, acrobatics and music. Also to prepare them for Sports week, the children will be practicing their running, throwing and jumping skills.

PSHE: Rules

This half term the children will be recapping how to deal with put downs and being honest. In addition the children will be exploring fairness and how to show loyalty through team work.

Computing: The children will be creating spreadsheets related to money and their Brazilian topic.
