The sessions, for parents of disadvantaged pupils in year 2 and 3, were led by Ms McClelland and explored how to support children's mental maths. Session 1 looked at addition subtraction and



session 2 focussed on multiplication (times tables). The children really enjoyed having their parents come into school to work with them and loved playing the fun maths games. Keep up the great practicing at home!

ONLINE SAFETY

ATTENDANCE & EXTENDED LEAVE

As it is coming to the end of the academic year, we have began to see an increase in requests for Extended Leave during term time. Tower Hamlets strongly discourage families removing pupils from school during term time. If parents want to remove their child/ren from school during term time they must complete a 'Leave in Term Time Request Form' before the child/ren go away (available from the school office). The Attendance Welfare Advisor, Sonia, will then get in touch to discuss the extended leave application. Such periods of absence are only authorised under very exceptional circumstances where supporting evidence is provided. The school follows the Tower Hamlets' 'Leave in Term

The school follows the Tower Hamlets' Leave in Term Time' policy, so please be aware that any application that is unauthorised and for a period over 3 days, will result in a Fixed Penalty Notice being issued. The full cost of the Penalty Notice is £120 per parent per child payable within 42 days (for example for a family with two parents and two children, the fine would be £480) The cost is reduced by half, if payment is made within 28 days. The payment is sent to Tower Hamlets. The school does not receive any of this money.

The government requires schools to know the whereabouts of its pupils in order to help make sure they are safe. Therefore, if you do intend to go away before the end of term, it is very important that you complete the 'Leave in Term Time Request Form' giving details of where you will be staying. If we do not receive this information and are unable to contact the family, we are required to complete a 'Child Missing in Education' form, which is sent to the local authority. This then becomes a safeguarding incident which social services will investigate.


5K LEARN SCIENCE AT BOW SCHOOL


5K recently visited Bow Secondary school to use their STEM facilities. In the Science Lab they got the chance to use chromatography. The children performed a series of experiments, in order to investigate the components within different coloured liquids, using a solvent to separate them. The children really enjoyed using the facilities and we thank Bow School for providing this exciting opportunity.



This academic year, Old Palace has been working hard to re-credit our award of the Science Mark. This has included providing training on the 10 Science Investigative skills that are taught in primary schools and exploring how children can be provided with opportunities to apply these when planning and carrying out their own scientific enquiries. Governors got an opportunity to view this first-hand during a recent learning walk.

DT STRUCTURE DAY





DT projects included making a replica of the Houses of Parliament out of Eames cards in year 2, domes out of wooden rods and connectors in year 6 and a giant caterpillar using the shape rhombicosidodecahedron in year 5! In years 3 and 4 they worked with art straws to create replicas of either an Egyptian pyramid or a truss bridge. Year 1 used shells structures to create 'bug hotels' and in Reception they made a rainforest tree using triangular tubes. As ever the children enjoyed using their creativity and came up with some excellent products. Well done!





CELEBRATING EID al ADHA

The school hosted its annual Challenge Partners Quality Review on 24-26th May. The review is led by a Lead Reviewer (who is Ofsted trained) along with three senior leaders from other schools across England. During their 3 days at the school, the reviewers watch lessons, looked at the children's books and talked to pupils and subject leaders about the learning that takes place.

Challenge Partners grades three areas: 'leadership at all levels', 'quality of provision' and 'outcomes for all pupils' and 'quality of provision and outcomes for disadvantaged pupils and pupils with additional needs'. We are proud to share that in all three areas we were awarded the highest possible grade: LEADING **Comments from the report include:**

- Leaders and staff across the school are exceptionally ambitious for all pupils
- Pupils have excellent attitudes to learning and towards others.
- The school has created an incredibly positive a mosphere for learning, blending challenge and support exceptionally well for both staff and pupils. Pupils thoroughly enjoy learning due to the creative and aspirational activities they tackle
- Pupils with SEND achieve very well. This is because the curriculum has been designed so that pupils with SEND can access and understand what they are being taught. Teachers employ a range of strategies to support this group of pupils ahead of and after the main teaching time.
- The senior leaders have a well thought out and rigorous vision for all pupils, their learning and wider development. The development of staff is planned and undertaken robustly by the senior staff. This means that the delivery of the curriculum is maintained to a high standard
- Leaders have ensured a strong level of consistency in the delivery of the phonics scheme and the reading curriculum across the school. Teachers model and articulate the sounds that letters make well and pay careful attention to supporting pupils in using their phonics knowledge to write words and sentences accurately.

The comments regarding phonics are particularly pleasing, given this was the one area that Ofsted said we needed to improve in KS1 & year 3. It should be noted, that Challenge Partners followed the correct procedure and observed pupils reading with a familiar adult. In our Ofsted Inspection, the Lead Inspector sent away the familiar adult and asked the children to read directly to her, which is a breach of Ofsted's own protocols

Please join me in congratulating the teachers, support staff and children on achieving such a positive outcome, which is testament to their hard work and dedication. The full report is available **HERE**
