
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#### **CELEBRATING BLACK HISTORY MONTH**

**COFFEE MORNINGS, WORKSHOPS & COURSES** Welcoming Meeting

**Meet our AWA & School Social Worker** On 27<sup>th</sup> September, the coffee morning was used to introduce some of the professionals who work with the school to support our fami-Sonia Rowlings, our Attendance Welfare Advisor from LBTH Hamlets, highlighted the important of good attendance and punctuality. She works closely with the school to secure high rates of attendance for all our pupils and helps the school enforce the penalty notice scheme when parents take their child/ren out of school for unauthorised holidays.

Shahnaz Choudhury, our School Social Worker explained how she provides support to schools in relation to safeguarding and securing the welfare and wellbeing of pupils. Provision aims to improve outcomes for vulnerable children and families through the delivery of Early Help and direct preventative work with families. Shahnaz delivers Parenting courses alongside our Parent Support Worker. Both Sonia & Shahanaz is available every Wednesdays 9-12pm. Appointments can be made via the school office.

**Bug Club & Google Classroom Support**During the coffee morning on  $21^{\rm st}$  September, we held a drop in session for parents who needed help and support with Google classrooms. Login details were provided and we demonstrated how to access the school platform.

Forida has also been providing one to one support for year 1 parents, who have been experiencing difficulties with accessing Bug Club, our digital reading platform.

If you are experiencing any difficulties using with these programmes, please speak to Shelly or Forida, who will be able to help.

**Sewing for Beginners Course** 

On 26<sup>Th</sup> September we started a 5 week 'Sewing for Beginners' course, run by Sarah McSweeney from Parental Engagement team. This beginner level course, trained parents in the basics of how to use a domestic sewing machine and learn simple but useful skills to start mending and altering their own clothes. As the course was incredibly popular we hope to be able to offer this again in the future. Thank you to all the parents who took part and showed your commitment by attending every session.

#### **ESOL CLASS**

The school has been working in partnership with the Idea Store to deliver ESOL classes for parents at Old Palace. The course was open to all parents who wanted to improve and learn English as a second language. A total of 25 parents applied to join the course. An an initial assessment was carried out by the Tutor from Idea store Tutor on Wednesday 4th October, of those, 13 parents have been accepted onto the course at Old Palace, which started on Thursday, 12th October 2023 from 1.30-3.30pm. 6 have been referred to Marner Children's Centre and have been advised to attend every Thursday 9.30-11.30am starting 2<sup>nd</sup> November. And finally, 5 parent were are at lower level and require in depth support therefore have been invited to attend classes at Idea Store, White-chapel from Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> October 1.00-3.00pm. The process is now closed, but anyone who maybe interested can apply directly to Idea store to do a ESOL course.

Oral Health Workshop
On 4<sup>th</sup> October, parents from Reception and Year 1 were invited to join our Oral Health Workshop. Michelle Ting from NHS Community Dental Services delivered a session and spoke to parents about how to prevent dental decay through regular brushing, use of high fluoride toothpaste, a healthy diet and regular visits to the dentist. Parents were also advised about the benefits of taking part in the school Fluoride Varnish Programme.

#### **Parent Council**



On Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> September, the Parent Councillors for last academic year were invited to attend an assembly so the school could say thank you for all the support they had given us. This is very much appreciated! As an extra treat, they then attended a buffet arranged by Shelly.

The school values the Parent Council as a means of extended parental engagement— parents who have not previously been involved are especially welcome. A coffee morning was held on 28th September to promote the role and to discuss any questions parents had before applica-tions opened. There was also an opportunity to meet for-

mer councillors to gain their insights.

So far we have recruited 14 brand new Parent Councillors. We also have 10 Councillors from last year who are happy to do the role again; while we are very thankful for their continued support, we would love to get more parents involved Therefore we have extended the deadline until after half term, in case there are any parents interested in joining for the first time. If that is you—please speak to Shelly or Forida. The first meetings will be taking place in November.

**Health & Wellbeing Walking Group**The weekly walking group, led by Shelly, is now taking place every Monday. There is no need to book– just arrive at the school gate by 9.15am. Each week the group takes a different route, walking and chatting enroute. Walking is a great form of exercise and supports mental wellbeing. The group is also a great way to form new friendships. We hope you can join us in the near future.

Transition Meeting Workshop On 14<sup>th</sup> September, we held our Year 6 transition information workshop. Aleha Khanum from the Parental Engagement Team was invited to come in and answer any questions parents had regarding the transition process. During the meeting she covered topics, such as how to apply online, what questions to ask when visiting secondary schools, how decisions on places are made, when parents will be notified and the appeals process. Aleha also covered information for our SEND families that have children with Educational Health Care Plans as the application process for these children is slightly different. Following these meetings, we held drop in session to provide support for parents who were experiencing difficulties with the online application process. Please ensure that you submit your application by 30th October 2023.

**School Free** Meals **Funding** On the 5th October, parents were invited to attend an information session on how to apply for Free School Meals. In Tower Hamlets all pupils receive a free school dinner, but some pupils are eligible for extra funding if their parents are on universal credit. Confusingly this is also referred to as Free School Meal entitlement. Forida, our parent support worker was on hand to help parents apply for this additional school funding using the LBTH online application form. Parents who were not able to complete an application on site where offered an 1:1 appointments at a later date.

#### **GOOD ATTENDANCE**

Thank you so much to all the families who have been arriving at school on time every day. Just some reminders below:

- Please arrive at school between 8:50am-9:02am. The gate will close at 9:02am and any time after this will be considered as a late mark.
- If your child is off for 3 days or more, you will be asked to submit medical evidence, such as a prescription, medical appointment or any other medicines prescribed.
- If your child is unwell, please contact the office first thing in the morning to update them so we know why your child is not in school. Continue to update the school if your child is not returning the next day.
- We ask that you make appointments for your child after school or during half terms, however if this is not possible you will be asked to provide evidence of the appointment.
- If you intend to take your child out of school during term time, ensure that you complete an Extended Leave form which can be obtained from the office. In the majority of cases a Fixed Penalty Notice will be issued to both parents unless evidence can be provided to show why the trip could not take place during normal school holiday. #### **YEAR 4 VISIT TATE MODERN GALLERY**



This half term, Year 4 visited the Tate Modern to explore the work of some famous European artists. The children were fascinated by some of the artworks, such as The Snail by Matisse, Ardek by Olle Baertling and Composition C with Red, Yellow and Blue by Piet Mondrian. They learnt more about artists like as Gustav Metzger & Gerhard Richter and movements such as the Dynamic Suprematism. The children found answers to questions as they navigated the galleries and at the end of the day took away lots of inspiration for their future art projects.

### **YEAR 1 VISIT THE SCIENCE MUSEUM**

In year 1 the children have been learning all about all the different materials that are used to make homes. They have been looking at the rooms inside our homes and finding out about the different objects we have inside them. To explore further, the children went on a trip to the Science Museum where they looked around the 'secret life of the home' exhibition. They found out about the different parts of a home and explored which materi-



als are used to make household objects. They also got to see how some of the familiar items in our homes have changed over time, which they really enjoyed.

We compared how they were used years ago, how they are used now and how they've changed. We watched videos about the parts of a home and what they look like inside now and in the past. We had lots of fun looking at lots of old transport, seeing some pictures of new transport and even got to explore the body space exhibit looking at the planets and space ships. It was a great day out for Y1!

### YEAR 5 VISIT ROMAN AMPHITHEATRE



Year 5 visited Guildhall Art Gallery, to take part in interacting with a Roman Amphitheatre. The children were able to witness the well-preserved Roman ruins in which crowds would once have gathered to watch wild animal fights, public executions and gladiatorial combats. The children were able to look at and touch items from Roman times. They really loved the Amphitheatre as they also got the chance to do some role play as if they were actual people who would have been in the Amphitheatre in Roman times. This is the first time Year 5 have visited this attraction, and we would definitely recommend it for next year!

#### YEAR 6 VISIT DOCKLANDS MUSEUM



Year 6 pupils had a chance the Docklands Museum in East London as a part of learning about the Industrial Revolution. The trip involved visiting both interactive exhibitions and hands-on workshop. It offered a unique opportunity for the Year 6s to delve into the stories of the people who shaped the area of East London. From the bustling days of maritime trade to the challenges faced during wartime, the museum provided a fascinating insight into the ever-evolving history of the docks. As our students explored the museum's exhibits, they developed a deeper appreciation for the rich tapestry of cultures and industries that have made the Docklands a vital part of London's heritage. They discovered how the area transformed from a hub of global trade to a thriving hub of arts and culture. Children were very excited to explore the past and enrich their understanding of London's history and its role in the world.



### YEAR 3 VISIT NATURAL HISTORY MUSEUM

This half term, year 3 visited the Natural History Museum to learn more about their science topic - Rocks and Dinosaurs. The children visited the world famous dinosaur gallery and were very excited to see a life sized robotic T-Rex that moved and roared! They also took part in a workshop, lead by the experts at the museum, discussing how we can identify the fossils of different dinosaurs by their features just like real palaeontologists - and we were able to visit the rocks and minerals galleries as well. We learned all about the formation of the earth and different types of rocks. From sparkly gems to ancient fossils! The children had a fantastic time on the trip and were able to apply this learning back in class

The performance was interactive providing a great way for the children to get involved and demonstrate their knowledge on the topics covered.

#### WELCOMING RECEPTION PUPILS & FAMILIES



At the start of September, we welcomed our new Reception pupils and their families to our school. Parents were given an activity pack to support at home with their children's learning in phonics, handwriting and early number work.

### **Baseline Assessments**

By the end of this half term all reception pupils had to complete a statutory baseline assessment.

This is a short, interactive assessment carried out in the first 6 weeks of reception between a child and their teacher.
