Maths

Please see below the order of the topics the children will be focusing on this half term:

- 1. Fractions, Decimals and Percentages-Children will learn how to convert between fractions, decimals and percentages and using this knowledge to calculate percentages of amounts
- **2. Coordinates -** Children will be learning how to plot, reflect and translate coordinates on a four quadrant grid
- **3. Algebra** Children will begin to solve simple algebraic equations and use these to help them work out the area of different shapes
- **4. Units of Measure** Children will learn how to convert different units of measure and work on their problem solving skills.
