CALENDAR PRINTING



All the children have created beautiful calendars using a variety of printing techniques for their families to enjoy all year round. Reception have explored different vegetables to make their prints, Year 1 and 2 did leaf prints and created repeated patterns. Year 3 made collagraphy printing boards using collage materials, Year 4 made relief prints using foam boards. In year 5, the children created mono prints using acetate and in Year 6 the children made lino printing blocks.

ART EXHIBITION



We hope that you had a chance to see the children's amazing artwork on display in our Parents Evening Exhibition last week. We had a range of outcomes from KS1 and KS2. In Year 1, the children had been learning about the life and work of Van Gogh and created their own

landscape painting in his style. In Year 2, the children had been studying narrative art and created their own pieces telling the story of the Great Fire of London. In Year 3, the children had been drawing portraits using the correct proportions and then practiced drawing in a Cubist style after learning about Picasso. In Year 5, the children had been exploring different drawing techniques and have learnt about the work and life of Stephen Wiltshire as well as 1 and 2 point perspective. They created their own London landmarks, combining all of this learning.

Year 6 were invited to attend and perform at the Tower Hamlets Book Awards at Morpeth School. Over the last few months, some of our avid year 6 readers have been reading the books written by the authors nominated for the Book Award and voted for the one they en-

joyed the best. Furthermore, they wrote a script for a scene from their favourite book and performed this at the Book Awards, alongside other schools. Their comedic performance earned them the award of Best Characterisation! Finally, they had the chance to meet the authors, ask them about their books and get some books signed for the school. They had a fantastic time and gave an incredible performancé! Well done!

YEAR 2 VISIT TOWER OF LONDON



This half term year 2 have been learning all about The Stuarts in their history topic including key figures and events such as the Gun Powder plot and The Great Fire of London. To build on their learning they visited the Tower of London, where they had the opportunity to see and explore the different towers and galleries including the

Bloody Tower where Guy Fawkes was kept, The White Tower and the Jewel House, where the Crown Jewels and other artefacts including various crowns worn by different kings and queens are kept. They also attended a workshop called 'Fire Fire!' where the children explored what had happened during The Great Fire of London through re-enactment. The children really enjoyed their time at the Tower of London and learnt a lot more about life during the Stuart reign.

YEAR 4 VISIT SCIENCE MUSEUM



Y6:

This half term year 4 have been learning all about electricity and sound. To further their learning they visited the Science Museum. At the museum they visited the 'Secret Life of the Home' object gallery where they found out the different ways electricity has changed and developed

our household appliances. This went from exploring automatic doors, burglar alarms, a coin slot, light bulbs and even how toilets worked! The children were able to answer so many questions just like true scientists! They really enjoyed exploring the museum and seeing how technology has changed overtime looking at household items from as early as the 18th century all the way up to now! With their new science knowledge and inspiration maybe they'll invent some of the appliances of the future!

YEAR 3 MAKE IT REAL PROJECT



This half term in Year 3, the children have been learning about life during the Stone Age, Iron Age and Bronze Age. They looked at different aspects of life during these times including shelter and food. The children learnt how in prehistoric Britain people needed to hunt and forage for food, they learnt that

sometimes this could be difficult particularly at different times during the year. They also learnt that people needed to move around a lot, to be able to find food, shelter and to be safe. This meant that their homes were often temporary. To help the children link their learning to present day they discussed how some people still struggle with things like having enough food, having a safe place to live and even for some being able to see a doctor or get medicine if they are unwell. The children then looked at how we can help people who might



be struggling with access to food, safety or medical care and researched a variety of different charities that work to help support people with this. The children then voted on the charity they would like to raise money for. The children selected the charity 'Doctors (MSF Borders without Medecins Sans Frontieres). This is an international, independent medical humanitarian

organisation, who work with countries to provide medical care and assistance to people affected by conflicts, epidemics, disasters or who are unable to have regular access to the health care they need. We reached out to the charity about where the donation would go and they stated the following:

By supporting us, you will be helping ensure we can respond to conflict situations around the world. We can guarantee that some of your donation will directly support MSF's response in Gaza.

To help raise money for Doctors without Borders, Year 3 brought out donation buckets in the morning and afterschool on Thursday 21st Dec and some parents kindly donated food and supported Shelly and Forida with prep and the selling of the food. We are extremely grateful to all of those who do-nated and supported year 3 in their fundraiser. In total, in just a few hours, we raised £603.64!!
