We went to The Children's Discovery Story Centre where we created our own story which was inspired by the creative environment.



Children also learned about Mary Seacloe and explored the challenges she faced when she came over from Jamaica to England to be a nurse. They compared the two nurses and also looked at similarities and differences in modern time nursing. They also looked at the work of Mother Teresa and developed an understanding of how she was Christian Nun and wanted to please God; she devoted herself to helping the poor and sick people in India.

Children wrote key facts about each of the inspirational people, they even role played using dressing up and props.

## **Other Subjects**
